Today's worship:

Today, in the old cycle of titles from the Book of Common Prayer, is the Sunday after the Ascension. Jesus continues his prayers for all who follow to be so that the love with which the Father loved him may be in them, and he in us. This abiding in God is part of our intentional prayer focus during the ten days leading up to Pentecost.

Contrasting this are the readings from the Acts and the conclusion of the Revelation to St John.

Paul was annoyed. Yes, he was miffed! It says it quite clearly in the text. Should one of God's chosen dare to be annoyed? Well, if you ask some, definitely not, but then, Jesus himself was annoyed at times (see Matthew 16; Mark 3,8; John 2, 11 and many other places...) So, is being annoyed a sin?

I hope not! There are times when things are simply frustrating. Repeatedly doing things and not getting any where – anyone worked with teenagers? “How many more times...” do you sometimes say?

For Paul, the testimony of the young lady literally ‘wore him down’. This would be a better understanding of the nuance behind the word used. And for his actions, he was then chained and left to rot until his chains fell off.

For us, if we find ourselves worn down and tired, maybe the love that is to be in us could be simply prayed with an ‘arrow’ prayer that concludes the Revelation to St John. “Even so, come Lord Jesus.” I think this would be much more effective a prayer than St Augustine's, “Lord, give me patience. NOW!”





Gisborne Community Care Foodbank

This is a notice to invite supporters and interested parties to attend a public meeting in order to Incorporate the Foodbank venture initiated by the local churches: 'Gisborne Community Care Foodbank Inc.'

Date and venue: Wednesday 12th June at 7.30pm at Gisborne Uniting Church
23 Brantome St Gisborne.

Proposal: To approve the proposal to Incorporate 'Gisborne Community Care Foodbank.'

A majority of votes cast by those present must authorise a person to incorporate the 'Gisborne Community Care Foodbank Inc.'

This is then to be lodged online.

We must also vote to approve a proposed set of rules that comply with the Incorporations Act or approve adoption of the 'Model Rules.'

This is to be submitted as part of the application. The incorporation will be a not for profit entity.

Its purpose is to collect and distribute food to improve food security in the Gisborne and surrounding areas (Lower Macedon Ranges) through a distribution base located at 23 Brantome St Gisborne. This has come about through the expressed desire by some of the ministers in the area to combine resources to meet an ever growing demand and need for assistance to those for whatever reason find themselves needing support.

The association must have at least 5 members and will not operate for profit of its members (although an incorporated association can provide services or benefits to its members.)
