

### Today's worship:

One question: three responses!

“Teacher, what must I do to gain eternal life?”

In Matthew 19.16-22, Jesus responds with the Ten Commandments, and a request that he sells everything he has and gives it to the poor. It is then we learn that the ‘one’ asking the question was both young and a considerable land owner. He left very sad. The ‘eye of the needle’ follows, but in Matthew’s usual way, it is also followed with the parable being explained.

In Mark 10, it is again a rich young man who begins by asking the same question by calling Jesus “Good Teacher”. Jesus responds with the same commandments, but there are two differences. Firstly, Jesus looks at the young man and loves him. Knowing the difficulty of what is being asked, this does not lead to his condemnation, but rather, the desire that the young man would be able to see this through. The famous ‘eye of the needle’ follows. The disciples are counselled regarding their sacrificial following of Jesus, immediately to be confronted with the third prediction of Jesus’ death.

In today’s gospel account, Luke 10.25-37, the plumb line of Amos is applied. Jesus responds with the Sh’mah, the summary of the law, and then in response to the Jesus’ use of neighbour, tells a story. The plumb line is not in the keeping of the commandments, but the application of the law. It’s one thing to know what to do, but are you doing it?

### Improving the Op Shop (including Sorting Shed) and Parish Hall, Gisborne

As part of the Mission Action Plan, the Space and Property Committee, have commenced a review of the facilities at the Parish Hall and Op Shop, (including the Sorting Shed) in Gisborne. The Parish Council selected these facilities, as a priority focus for 2019.

Commencing its work in April, the committee has undertaken the following;

- i) Reviewed past building assessment and advice on renovation works for the Hall,
- ii) Inspected the site and shared insights about the condition of the facilities.
- iii) Identified various options for possible works and obtained costs estimates to enable cost benefit analysis and an indicative budget to be developed. Item iii) is continuing.

The committee has developed a time-line for this planning project with the aim of having a recommendation to be considered at the Parish AGM in November. To meet this timeline and to ensure consultation with the Parish and the other stakeholder groups can occur, the following consultation activities are proposed;

During the month of July, targeted consultation with;

- Op Shop/Sorting Shed Leaders and Volunteers
- Playgroup and Children's Ministry staff and Parent Committee
- Messy Church Leaders
- Parish Fair Committee and
- Bric'a'Brac Sale Organisers.

These consultations will ask participants to share the challenges they face in using the facilities and their ideas for improvement to facilities. Opportunities to attend a scheduled meeting or to complete a survey will be offered. The survey will also be available to All parishioners and available at the Church Centres, during the month of July.

The information gathered during this period will be considered by the committee in formulating a Development Proposal to the Parish. Once a draft proposal has been formulated and considered by the Parish Council, a further opportunity for Parishioners to comment on the proposal will be scheduled, prior to a final proposal being presented to the 2019 AGM.
