Pray Safe!

Please note that your Kingdom Kit has small parts and should only be used with adult supervision as it contains items which could cause danger if not used properly.

Choking Hazards – Sweets

WARNING: CHOKING HAZARD – Some products may contain nuts or milk. Not suitable for children under 3 years.

Suffocation Hazard – Bubble Wrap

WARNING: CHOKING HAZARD – Children under 8 years can choke or suffocate on plastic bubble wrap. Adult supervision required. Keep out of reach of children.

WARNING: Do not consume or drink bubble liquid. Not suitable for children under 3 years.

Fire Hazard – Paper burning activity

WARNING: FIRE HAZARD – only burn paper where it is safe and within sight. Adult supervision required. Never burn paper on or near anything that can catch fire.

Fire and Burn Hazard – Sparklers. Please follow safety warnings on individual packaging.

WARNING: Not to be given to children under 5 years of age. Wear gloves when using sparklers and keep away from any part of the body and flammable material. Dispose of hot sparkler remains in a bucket of hot water.

How it works!

For every day from Ascension (Day 1) through to Pentecost (Day 11), we have provided a daily prayer prompt and an accompanying activity on the given theme. As well as lifting your friends and family up to God it is also a fun and engaging way to pray! If you have older children they may want to start with the extreme prayer challenge straight away!

Day: Prayer: You will Need: The Activities:

Go Large:

Day 1 #ToJesus	God of Glory, I follow you...	Ink pads, paper and pens	Use the ink pads and make footsteps with your thumb prints – draw toes on with a pencil. Pray that five friends or family who don't know Jesus come to know the love of Christ.	Full-sized footprints! Get the biggest paper you can, maybe a roll of old wallpaper or newspaper pages. Get messy and paint with your feet, taking steps towards Jesus whilst praying for family and friends to know Him!
Day 2 #Praise	God of Grace, I praise you and thank you for...	Colouring pens / pencils and paper chains	Write or draw the things you can praise God for on each paper chain. Stick the chains together and put them up where you will see them every day. Pray that your five family and friends will see the things in their lives they could praise God for.	Super-size your prayer paper chain – What's the longest chain of things to praise God for that you can put up around your church, hall or house? Spend time praising Him for all these things and praying that friends and family will know the joy of praising God
Day 3 #Thanks	God of Grace, I give thanks...	Silver Stars. Colouring pens/ pencils	Write the names on the silver stars of the five people you are praying for. Decorate and pray to God with thanks that you have the chance to show them His grace. Exodus 34:5-7	Why not hold a prayer feast with your group or church? Each member of the group can bring something to share and eat. Give thanks as you eat the food everyone has prepared. Then as a group pray for your 5 people.
Day 4 #Sorry	God of Forgiveness, I am sorry for when I have...	Paper for writing	Write some of the things that you are sorry to God for. As you pray (and only if you have somewhere safe to do it) burn your papers. Say prayers of 'sorry' to God and pray for your friends and family that they might learn about God's forgiveness. If that's not safe you can cut them into tiny pieces until they are all gone.	Take things outside and using a stomp rocket – tape your 'sorries' to the rocket and see who can make it fly the highest. You could have a paper plane competition in your church or hall – see who can fly their plane the furthest. It will never be further than the East is from the West! (Ps 103:12)
Day 5 #Offer	God of Vision, I offer you...	Template for making a box, pens or pencils	Write something that you can offer to God as a gift on the template boxes. It could be kindness to a friend, or your skills or talents for Him to use. Next, write things that are great about each of the others on their boxes. Make up your gift boxes and place them all in the centre of your table, then pray to God, offering your gifts to Him and asking how you can use them to help your friends and family to know Jesus.	Find a large mirror, and ask people in your church or group to stand in front of it. When you see your reflection think about how you can be Christ like to those around you. Have people write the good things you have to offer God around your reflection using board markers (check they wipe off!). The best thing we can offer is ourselves, and in doing so we imitate Christ. We are enough because we are created in love. Ephesians 5:1-2, 1 Corinthians 6:19-20.
Day 6 #PrayFor	God of Compassion, I pray for...	Sweets	As you share the sweets with your family, think of each of the people that you have chosen and pray for them as you enjoy a sweet. 2 Corinthians 1: 3-4	Play hide and seek. Write down the name of the people you are praying for on a piece of paper. Whilst you are being looked for pray for God's love to be clear to each of the people.
Day 7 #Help	God of Ages, I ask your help...	Bubbles	Think about the things that have been worrying you today, as you blow the bubbles, pray to God to help you with your worries. As the bubbles pop and disappear think of how God can help with our problems. Pray for your five family and friends to know God's help.	You will need some volunteers from your group and plenty of toilet roll. Wrap them from head to toe in bandages. As a group think of things you can ask God's help for then pray as you bandage someone until they're helpless! Psalm 46:1
Day 8 #Adore	God of Love, I adore you...	Paper hearts, pens and pencils	Decorate the paper hearts with the names of people to be prayed for and tell God how much we love Him. Pray that these five people may come to love Him also.	Create a tree full of paper hearts draw a large tree on the biggest paper you can find or use a real tree if you want. Your whole church or group can pray for their friends and family to come and know Jesus. Cover the tree in paper hearts!
Day 9 #Celebrate	God of joy, I celebrate...	Sheets of bubble wrap	Think about the things in your life that you want to celebrate. Pop the bubbles as you pray for each of your five family and friends to be able to celebrate the joy that is to know Jesus. Try twisting the bubble wrap and popping lots of bubbles at once.	Take a ball of twine or string and stretch it out around the house, church or hall. As you go tie knots in it and wind it around objects in the house, church or hall. Then get everybody to follow the string around and every time they come to a knot say a prayer of celebration and for a family member or friend to know Jesus.
Day 10 #Silence	God of Mystery, I enter your silence...	Finger mazes, pens or pencils	Trace a route through the maze with your finger. Psalm 130:5-6 tells us to wait for the Lord. In the silence ask God to show himself to you and ask how you can talk to your five family or friends about Jesus.	Make a big labyrinth and encourage people to move around it in silence. You could put posters or verses for people to reflect on at different stages, have some music or activities to help people pray. Make your labyrinth from rope or chairs, tables, whatever you have!
Day 11 #Thy Kingdom Come	God of Heaven and Earth, I do this in Your Name...	Seeds	Take out the prayer card and pray the Lord's Prayer together. Plant the seeds in a pot or the ground, and pray for five friends and family to come to know Jesus. Be encouraged and reminded to keep praying for them and talking to them as the seeds grow.	Buy some sparklers and use them to write in the air the names of people you have been praying for (buy sparklers here - www.partyrama.co.uk). Your church/group could hold a Pentecost service, (there are plenty of resources, service templates and ideas at www.thykingdomcome.global). Maybe even have a bonfire or BBQ after your service and get people to invite the five friends and family they've been praying for. Acts 2: 46 - 47
