





The Introductory Rites

Processional Chant: Trisagion

When the bell rings, we stand to sing:





We acknowledge the triune God, the Creator of heaven and earth and His ownership of all things. (Psalm 24:1) We recognise that He gave stewardship of these lands upon which we meet to the First Nations Peoples of this country (Acts 17:26). In His sovereignty, He has allowed other people groups to migrate to these shores. We acknowledge the cultures of our First Nations Peoples and are thankful for the community that we share together now. We pay our respects to Wurundjeri Woi Wurrung of the Kulin nation and their elders, both past and present.

We should glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, in whom is our salvation, life and resurrection, through whom we are saved and delivered.

▶ In the name of The Father, and of The Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Tonight we begin the Great Three Days of our Lord's passion, death and resurrection, the journey from the supper table to the cross, from the cross to Easter dawn. We are followers in his way, exploring his truth, encountering his life.

This is the night when Christ the Lamb of God gave himself into the hands of those who would betray him. This is the night when Christ gathered with his disciples in the upper room. This is the night when Christ our Lord gave us this holy feast, that as we break the bread and drink the cup we may here proclaim his holy sacrifice, and come at the last to his table in heaven.

This is the night when Christ took a towel and washed the disciples' feet, showing us how to honour and serve one another in love. This is the night for watching and prayer. We give ourselves freely to the demands of these great days, confident that those who die in Christ will surely live with him.

Reception of the Holy Oils

As we begin, therefore, we receive from our Administrator, Bishop Genieve, the holy oils blessed and set apart for the sacramental life of our parish.

Those appointed present the oils to the priest at the chancel step, presenting in turn:

The oil of the sick:

By the laying on of hands and anointing with this oil, and with the prayerful support of this community, may those who are sick experience the healing presence of Christ.

Amen.

The oil of Catechumens:

Anointed with this oil, and assisted by the example of this community, may those who are to be baptised know that Christ calls them by name and makes them his own and shares with them his victory over sin and the power of evil.

Amen.

The oil of chrism:

Anointed with this fragrant oil, may all who are baptised and confirmed, all who are ordained to the service of God's people, and this community whose house of prayer is dedicated to God's glory, fill the world with the sweet fragrance of Christ's gospel and be built up as living stones into a temple filled with the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

Father, forgive us.



THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading

A reading from the book of Exodus

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: 'This month is to be the first of all the others for you, the first month of your year. Speak to the whole community of Israel and say, "On the tenth day of this month each man must take an animal from the flock, one for each family: one animal for each household. If the household is too small to eat the animal, a man must join with his neighbour, the nearest to his house, as the number of persons requires. You must take into account what each can eat in deciding the number for the animal. It must be an animal without blemish, a male one year old; you may take it from either sheep or goats.

You must keep it till the fourteenth day of the month when the whole assembly of the community of Israel shall slaughter it between the two evenings. Some of the blood must then be taken and put on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses where it is eaten.

That night, the flesh is to be eaten, roasted over the fire; it must be eaten with unleavened bread and bitter herbs. You shall eat it like this: with a girdle round your waist, sandals on your feet, a staff in your hand. You shall eat it hastily: it is a Passover in honour of the Lord.

That night, I will go through the land of Egypt and strike down all the first-born in the land of Egypt, man and beast alike, and I shall deal out punishment to all the gods of Egypt, I am the Lord! The blood shall serve to mark the houses that you live in. When I see the blood I will pass over you and you shall escape the destroying plague when I strike the land of Egypt. This day is to be a day of remembrance for you, and you must celebrate it as a feast in the Lord's honour. For all generations you are to declare it a day of festival, for ever."


Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Therefore earth unites with heaven to sing a new song of praise; we too join with angels and archangels as they proclaim your glory without end:









Come. This is not the table of The Church, but of The Lord, and all are welcome at His table. Come.

We receive communion at the Chancel Step. All baptised Christians are welcome to receive communion today. During communion, we listen to the anthem "Lamb of God" by Samuel Webb.

THE CONCLUDING RITES

Post Communion Antiphon and Prayer

This is the Body that will be given up for you; this is the cup of the new covenant in my Blood, says the Lord; do this, whenever you receive it, in memory of me.

Let us pray:

Lord Jesus Christ, we thank you that in this wonderful sacrament you have given us the memorial of your passion: grant us so to reverence the sacred mysteries of your body and blood that we may know within ourselves and show forth in our lives the fruit of your redemption, for you are alive and reign, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Transference of the Blessed Sacrament

Following the prayer after communion, the Blessed Sacrament is placed on the Altar of Repose. The Ministers then return to the sanctuary to strip and anoint the altar in silence as the lights are extinguished from the church. The stripping of the Altar reminds us of Jesus going out into the Garden of Gethsemene, where he will be taken, stripped of all his dignity and nailed to a cross. The starkness of this moment is to remind us of the awful events that are to come. While the altar is being stripped and anointed, the choir sing the anthem "KEEP WATCH WITH ME" At the conclusion of this, we depart in silence or keep vigil at the altar of repose.

ABM Reflection

The New Commandment to love one another is what gives today its name as Maundy is a corruption of Mandatum, the Latin word for a command. And Jesus says that it is by our love that people will know that we are his disciples. How can we show more love in our own lives? How can we show more love in our parishes and throughout the whole Church? For if we do not have love for one another, who will see Jesus through us?
