A note from your Acting Vicar

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

It is good to be again ministering among you. So much seems to have happened in the parish since I went to care for the parish of Melton about twelve months ago. There is much gratitude in my heart for our associate clergy, Debra, Graham, David, Charles and Warren, who have done so much to help this parish through some difficult times recently. I am also thankful for the efforts of so many parishioners who have put in extra effort to keep things running smoothly. It is appreciated that many of you are feeling tired; nevertheless, I will remind you that the Lord will provide you with what you need and not ask of you more than you can give.

In the face of considerable personal challenges, our church wardens, Brett and Marilyn, continue to offer extraordinary service to this parish. I was saddened to see John Lee Tet has resigned as Vicar's warden after several years of excellent assistance. Mrs Ann Sowden is my nominee to fill the vacancy.

My letter of appointment is for three days a week, which the wardens have agreed shall be (usually) Wednesdays, Thursdays and Sundays. It is my intention that in most weeks, I will preside at the Wednesday and Sunday morning Eaucharists, and be in the parish centre 9.30 to 2.30 on Thursdays. I also will attempt to be at the afternoon service at St John's on the second and fourth Sundays. Being a half-time appointment, unfortunately, leaves little time for regular pastoral visiting; however if you have a particular need do not hesitate at all to ask me for a visit. Acting Vicars are not meant, usually, to make major changes, so do not expect much different to the past. A change that I am making is to revert to two Sunday morning services, 9.00 am at St Paul's and 10.30 am at CoR. Please be patient with me as I reacquaint myself with the parish and establish a new working regime. Every blessing Fr Alan.

The Ministry of Prayer

A member of the Parish leads us in prayer.

The Greeting of Peace

Christ has reconciled us to God by one body on the cross. We meet in his name and share his peace. The peace of the Risen Lord be always with you. And also with you.

All may share a sign of peace with those around them.

The Offertory

During the Hymn, our gifts of bread, wine and money are collected and then offered at the Altar.

Why do we share this bread and wine?

On the night before he died, when darkness had fallen, Jesus took bread. He gave thanks, broke it, and shared it with his disciples, saying: 'This is my body, given for you. Do this to remember me.'

After they had eaten, he took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and shared it with his disciples, saying: 'This is my blood, poured out for you and for many, for the forgiveness of sins.'

So Father, with this bread and this cup we celebrate his love, his death, his risen life. As you feed us with these gifts, send your Holy Spirit, and change us more and more to be like Jesus our Saviour. How do we follow Jesus Christ?

Help us, Father, to love one another, as we look forward to that day when suffering is ended, and all creation is gathered in your loving arms. And now with all your saints we give you glory, through Jesus Christ, in the strength of the Spirit, whom we join in their never-ending song:

Blessing and honour and glory and power are yours for ever and ever.

On this Sunday some years ago, I celebrated the eucharist for Iranian Christians in a refugee detention centre. The doors were locked because we had been made afraid of them. This place of torture was designed to keep out all signs of hope and compassion. But guards and razor wire could not keep the risen Lord out.
