Lent

The season of Lent, observed in various Christian denominations, marks a period of reflection, repentance, and spiritual preparation leading up to Easter. It lasts for forty days, symbolizing Jesus Christ's forty days of fasting in the wilderness. During Lent, believers engage in practices such as prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, seeking to deepen their relationship with God and grow in spiritual discipline. It's a time to confront personal shortcomings, embrace simplicity, and focus on the ultimate sacrifice of Jesus. Through introspection and penance, Christians aim to renew their faith and emerge spiritually refreshed for the celebration of Easter.

A Reflection on Psalm 22

Part I - V: 1-21

Lament and Supplication - The Power of Darkness

V. 1-2

My God, my God, why have you forsaken me:
why are you so far from helping me
and from the words of my groaning?

My God, I cry to you by day, but you do not answer:
and by night also I take no rest.

V. 3-8

But you continue holy:

you that are the praise of Israel.

In you our forebears trusted:

they trusted, and you delivered them;

To you they cried and they were saved:

they put their trust in you and were not confounded.

But as for me, I am a worm and no man:

the scorn of all and despised by the people.

Those that see me laugh me to scorn:
they shoot out their lips at me
and wag their heads, saying,
'He trusted in the Lord—let him deliver him:
let him deliver him, if he delights in him.'

But you are he that took me out of the womb:

V. 22-26

The Prayers of the People

The response to "God of hope, in your mercy," is
"hear our prayer".

At the end of the prayers, we are invited to pray together:

The Greeting of Peace and Offertory

All stand for the Greeting of Peace with these words.

The Great Thanksgiving

The people remain standing and the Presider says

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

All glory and honour be yours always and everywhere,
mighty Creator, everliving God.

We give you thanks and praise for your Son,
our Saviour Jesus Christ,

who by the power of your Spirit was born of Mary
and lived as one of us.

He was tempted in every way as we are,
yet he did not sin.

By his death on the cross
and rising to new life,

he offered the one true sacrifice for sin
and obtained an eternal deliverance for his people.

By his grace we are able
to triumph over every evil,
and to walk in the way of his love.

Therefore with angels and archangels,
and with all the company of heaven,
we proclaim your great and glorious name,
for ever praising you and saying:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.**

Merciful God, we thank you
for these gifts of your creation,
this bread and wine,

On the night he was betrayed Jesus took bread;

he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying,
'Take, eat. This is my body given for you.
Do this in remembrance of me.'
After supper, he took the cup,
and again giving you thanks
he gave it to his disciples, saying,
'Drink from this, all of you.
This is my blood of the new covenant
shed for you and for many
for the forgiveness of sins.
Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'

made once for all upon the cross,
his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension,
and looking for his coming again,
we celebrate, with this bread and this cup,
his one perfect and sufficient sacrifice
for the sins of the whole world.

into the joy of your eternal kingdom;
through Jesus Christ our Lord,
with whom, and in whom,
in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit,

As our Saviour Christ has taught us, we are confident to pray:

**Our Father in heaven,

and deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power,

The Breaking of Bread and the Communion

The Presider says

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.
We who are many are one body,
for we all share in the one bread.

Jesus, Lamb of God, **have mercy on us.**
Jesus, bearer of our sins, **have mercy on us.**
Jesus, redeemer of the world, **grant us your peace.**

Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.
Happy are those called to his supper.

**Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,
but only say the word and I shall be healed.**

This is the table, not of the Church, but of the Lord.
All are welcome at his supper. Come.

The Sending Out of God's People

The Presider says a post-communion prayer.

God of mercy,
may we who have shared in this holy meal
know your forgiveness in our lives,
bring your reconciliation to others,
and be a sign of your wholeness in this broken world.

**Take our hands and work through them;
take our lips and speak through them;
take our minds and think through them;
take our hearts and set them on fire with love for you.**


