

Stewardship, Budgeting and Parish Finances

Like all parts of the community, the ability to utilise our financial resources is becoming more and more difficult. With a compulsory base increase of Award wages at 5.75% and increased power and gas, the Parish now needs to reduce some costs and overheads.

All aspects of Parish life will be under review. Already the Parish has taken advantage of the roll-out of heat pumps and LED lighting as offered by the State Government. Hot water services that are more efficient and cheaper have been installed in the Parish Hall, Parish Centre, Church of the Resurrection and St John's Riddells Creek. LED lighting was reviewed and replaced in the Parish Centre and Parish Hall. Further reviews are underway, with changes to be made as required.

The spotlight at Mount Macedon is now LED, not halogen powered, and linked to a timer. St Paul's has replaced the under-seat heating with current efficient heating and cooling. Heating and cooling at the Church of the Resurrection will require a major review.

The pew bulletin is undergoing a complete overhaul. Thanks to some generous benefactors, all centres will be equipped with screens (television or projector). Hymns and the like will be projected. Already you will note in this Pew bulletin that some aspects of the services have been redacted. With the removal of hymns, this will hopefully reduce the bulletin to 8 pages from the usual 16. Reducing the bulletin size will halve the budget for printing each week. Already St John's is not using the pew bulletin for services.

Office arrangements will also be under review regarding licensing requirements of various software and subscriptions. Open-source software will be a major consideration rather than proprietary software.

Over and above this, we also need to look at our income generation. Parish Council has met with the Shire Council to consider our plans. We will all be tightening our belts, but please, review your giving if you can, and pray with us for our mission of helping to make Christ fully known.

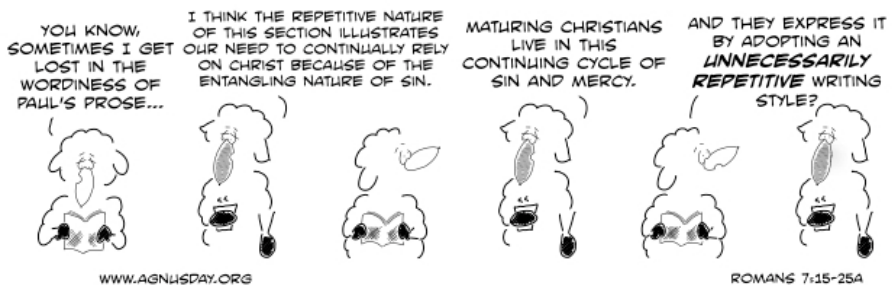
- Pray that we burdened by many things learn to find rest for our souls.
